The poplar pollard is the black poplar (*Populus nigra*) grown under periodical pollarding by the rural communities of the Iberian Chain for the production of building limbs, firewood and fodder. It's a traditional forestry management system which makes compatible an intense cattle raising charge with the production of wood. Periodical pollarding quarantes high productivity and increases tree's longevity. Poplar pollard specimens rare in large dimensions and with notable ages are common. Black poplar pollards shape one unique landscape with its own personality, one cultural heritage bequeathed forward by ancestors, one peerless vegetal architecture, and they play ecological functions in Iberian system agrosystems. During the second half of the XXth century social and economic changes happened which have resulted in lack of exploitation and the functional crisis of the trees, however in a growing social appreciation as heritage element as well. Aragon's Government has declared Good of Immaterial Cultural Interest the knowledge of the people who have created and taken care of poplar pollards. And it has created the Park of the Poplar Pollard of the High Alfambra, an ethnologic, landscaping and historical heritage conservation tool that poplar pollards grasslands are and a social and economic development mean in this territory

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
