



# "Moça Séria não é Estuprada": Representações Sociais em Comentários Online

The objective was to analyze the social representations of rape against women in comments on an online news story. 100 online comments were selected, from 5 news items, on a national journalism platform, from a television and internet communication network. The criteria for selecting the news were: the occurrence of the fact in 2018 and the availability of the news to any online reader, not just subscribers. The selected comments were those with more than two words to understand a context of meaning. Among the results found, it is possible to highlight that the representation of rape shared online presents women as guilty for exposing themselves to situations considered to be at risk. The woman is seen as one who looks for sex and who is aware of the consequences of that search. In this "serious girl" perspective, she should not seek sex, attend parties and drink alcohol. This representation leads the woman to blame and limit herself in her actions, to then avoid rape. Thus, it is possible to verify that the representation of rape against women seems to be anchored in representations associated with women and gender stereotypes

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
