This article is a brief reflection and historical approach to teacher training in Spain. Deriving from national systems of education a need is created to set up a teaching orga- nization dedicated to serving the State. The first Teacher Training College was established in Madrid in 1839, under the direction of Pablo Montesinos, with the intention of training people to govern the Teacher Training Colleges in all the provinces. The first curriculum was established in 1843 and was mandatory for all Teacher Training Colleges. In 1845 there already exis- ted 42 Teacher Training Colleges It includes the Spanish throughout the provinces inclu- ding those in Cáceres and Badajoz. Some years later the Teacher Training College for girls were created. Throughout this period the Colleges suffered from a lack of resources with different organizations and curricula. The best of these was that set up during the Second Republic in 1931. Special mention should be made of the curriculum established by the Law of Claudio Moyano in 1857, the Minister Bergamín Plan of 1914, the Villar Palasí plan of 1971 and the current plan of 1991. From the year 2010, the Bolonia plan will set up the new Masters Degrees in Infant and Primary Education in all the Spanish Universities

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
