This article offers a new approach to the Ínsula Baratarias episode in Don Quixote, by establishing the traditional relationship between the islands theme and the treaties of good government. Cervantes had access to the classics and bizantines specula principum through the translations of Diego Gracián and, above all, the Comentario en breve of his friend Cristóbal Mosquera de Figueroa. But he new also the ordinary legal use of Agapetos advices and the emperor Justinianos laws in his time, which he adapted, in a novelistic way and with sharp wit, to the Sancho Panzas government.
